The **LOUISIANA LANDSCAPE LEXICON**, developed over four monthly visits, will consist of an expanded visual glossary of geomorphologic features particular to coastal, riverine, and upland Louisiana. The unique vernacular lexicon of Creole language terms describing the topographic and geographic landscapes of the Louisiana territories will be sorted into four thematic volumes: **Cadastral Survey**, **Riverine Bayou**, **Coastal Wetlands**, and **Forests and Plains**. A speculative and projective view of these glossary terms will explore novel transformations of regional landforms, deploying inventive Anthropocene landscape strategies for an uncertain future impacted by climate change.
